“Bayous are OK”

East Harris County Receiving only Two Inches of Rain

(Harris County, TX) –Harris County Office of Homeland Security & Emergency Management reports that sensors indicate that bayous are well within their banks and well within capacity. The hardest hit areas of east Harris County have received only two inches of rain. Only a isolated area within a five-mile radius received more than two inches and is experiencing no rise in water level.

“Right now the bayous are OK. They are will within their banks and people do not need to worry about flooding as a result of the bayous at this time. If that changes, we will let you know,” says Harris County Judge Robert Eckels.

The Harris County Flood Control District has been praised by Harris County Judge Robert Eckels for their ongoing efforts to manage the region’s flood control efforts after the Tropical Storm Allyson event.

Harris County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management will announce any rise in bayou levels that warrant residents to take related precautions.
